## **Wildlife—high school and middle school**

The wildlife profiles this year is **set 1** for high school and for middle school. Middle schools do not use wildlife articles found in *Wildlife in NC* magazine. High schools are responsible for Nature's Way articles and North Carolina Wild Notebook articles for the 12 monthly 2009 issues of the *Wildlife in North Carolina* magazine. We have developed a list of 30 common mammals/animals that the teams are responsible for identifying by skins, skulls, scat, sign, mounts, etc. This list will be on the High School Wildlife site. The endangered species list has been updated this year and is included both in the Middle School and High School resources.
