

NORTH CAROLINA ORAL PRESENTATION COMPONENT VISUAL AIDS

Visual aids can be a powerful tool when making a presentation in the Oral Component of the North Carolina Envirothon. Charts, graphs, maps, flow charts, illustrations and lists are a few of the commonly used visual aids. Since a limited number of visual aids can be used, teams should carefully consider their use for maximum impact. Judges will be seated approximately 10-15 feet away from the presenters so the visual aids should be designed accordingly.

The oral presentation component will be held outside under a tent. Design your visual aids accordingly.

Only materials from the following list can be used when making these visual aids. Use of any other materials will not be acceptable. In addition, all lettering, drawing and illustrations shall be done by hand. No computer generated or pre-printed materials will be allowed. No other props or electronic devices of any type may be used. Team members may carry standard 3" x 5" note cards to assist them in their speaking roles.

One easel will be provided at each judging station.

Approved Materials for Construction of Visual Aids

- No larger than 24"x36" poster boards (Maximum of 2 poster board or foam core board, both sides of the poster boards may be utilized)
- Colored construction paper
- Tape or glue
- Pens, pencils, markers, or paint
